Revealing or Concealing?

It is human nature to want to add colour and detail to a story, the problem is when the added detail takes away from the meaning. A bit like the danger of jokes and stories in sermons which make them more interesting but are then the bits that people remember rather than the point they are supposed to illustrate. So it is with the mysterious visitors to the infant Jesus, unnumbered let alone named, in Scripture but emerging through tradition as the three kings, each with an ethnicity and name. So familiar have they become that it is easy to forget that for the author of Matthew's Gospel they represent all that is foreign and alien. Magi, from the same root word as magic, represents forbidden knowledge and the worship of other gods and they come from the East, from where had come the conquerors who had destroyed the independent kingdoms of Israel and Judah in the 8th and 6th centuries BC. In this Epiphany season we celebrate the revelation of Christ to the Gentiles but how seriously do we take the point that Christ is made known to those who are very unlike us, have ways of which we disapprove and frankly with whom we would like to have as little to do as possible?
